These filters are used to extend shutter speeds without altering the film/sensor's opening or sensitivity, or alternatively, to use large openings without exceeding the maximum shutter speed of a camera. [22] A variation of this filter, called the gradated neutral density filter or simply "ND grad", transitions from dark gray, neutral on one side to lighten on the opposite side. Photographers use these filters to lower natural contrasts by reducing light transmission from the brightest part of the subject landscape, leaving light from the darkest part of the landscape to enter the unobstructed lens. [23] UV-Zero hand filters reduce the "purple spray" caused by ultraviolet light, especially in digital situations. They are also recommended by some professional photographers as protection for the vulnerable lens, especially when outdoors or in dynamic situations.
